Related to: Conga, timbales

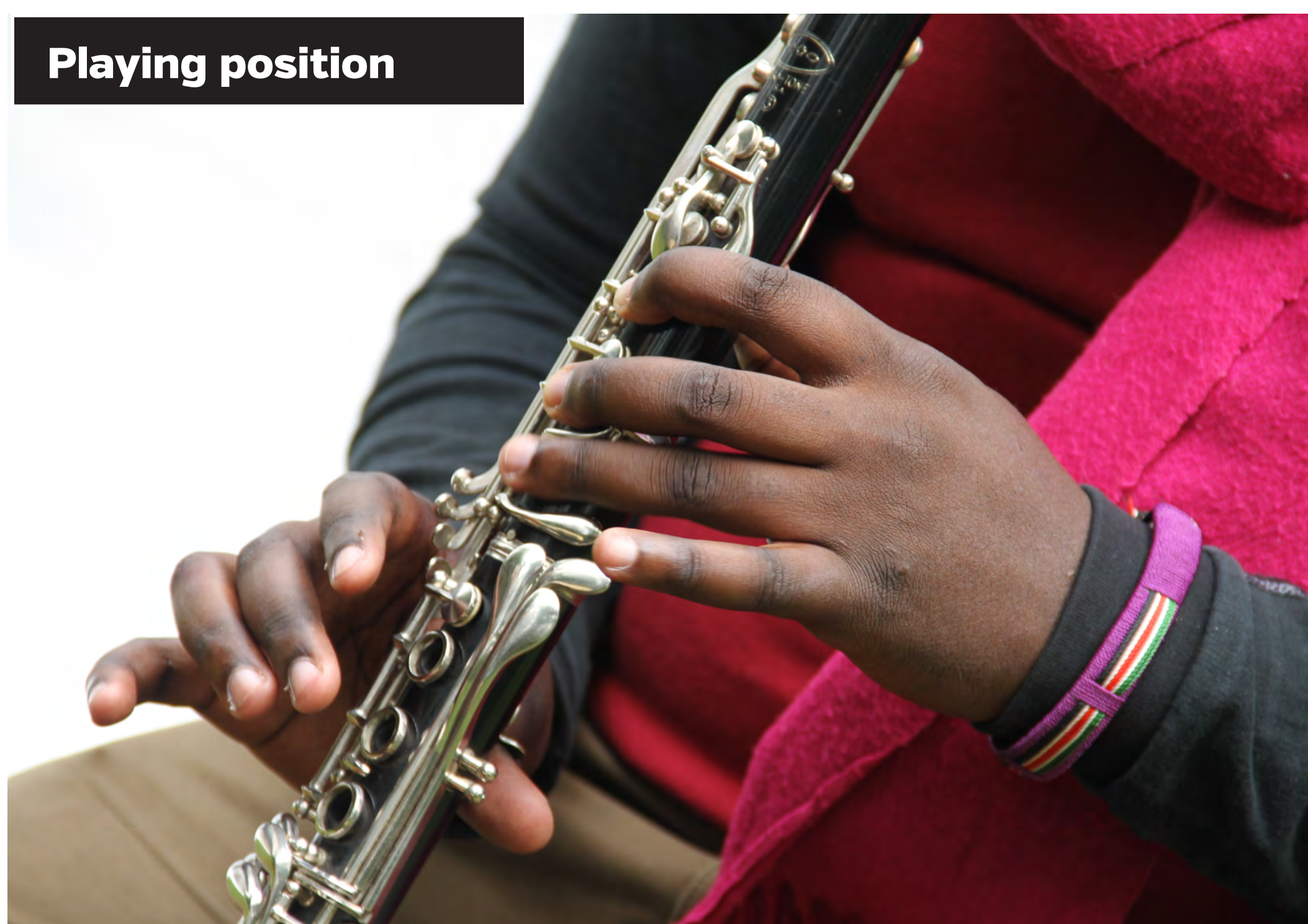

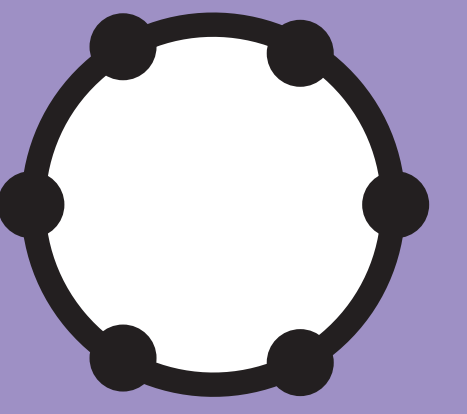

Related to:	Recorder, clarinet, saxophone

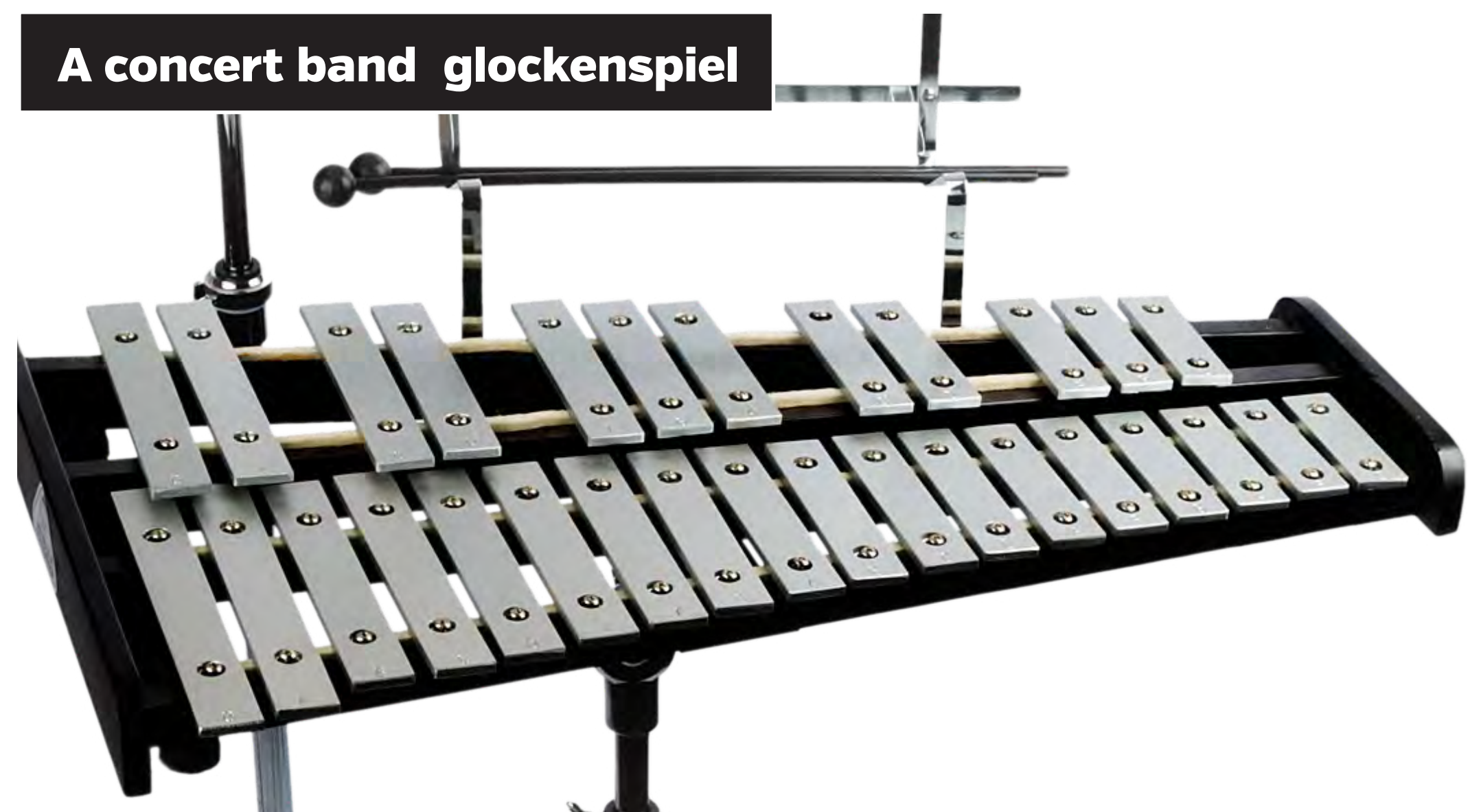
Glockenspiel



A bell lyre glockenspiel



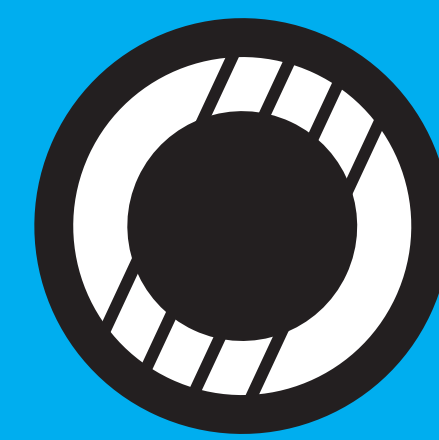
A concert band glockenspiel
